### **Armistice Day 2021**

This year it falls on Thursday 11th November. There will be an act of remembrance outside the Memorial Hall on this day, commencing at around 10:45 am, with two minutes' silence at 11 am. Two poppy wreaths will be placed on the memorials in the usual tradition. The act will be led by the Rev. Michelle Ireland, minister for several local Methodist churches including Aylburton.



### Thank you to our tub-tenders

We are very grateful for anyone who spared some time to water and deadhead a nearby flower tub or two. The flowers in the tubs will continue until the first frost, so if you've been doing some deadheading, keep going!

### Calling green-fingered businesses

We're putting out 2022–24 grass-cutting/weed control contracts out to tender very soon. There will be three contracts: village mowing and flower tubs, Upper Common mowing, and village weed control. If you'd like to receive the information packs for any/all of these please get in touch using the contact details given above.

### Road safety

We are looking to draw up a comprehensive plan for road safety in the village. As well as continuing to push for a pedestrian crossing, we are looking at lobbying Highways for options such as a reduction to 20 mph and an ANPR camera. We will be asking for your views on the plan to make sure it focuses on what the community wants.

### Remember not to lose your way

In case you missed it last time, we're mentioning it again. It's thought that many historic footpaths aren't officially mapped, which means in future they could be lost altogether. But you can help by taking a look at the county's definitive map at shorturl.at/luHM0 and checking that the paths you know of are already there. If they aren't, contact Gloucestershire County Council (or the Parish Clerk if you'd like the parish council's help in approaching the county council). ### Flooding improvements where are we at?

It's now been just over a year since Gloucestershire County Council committed to taking action to reduce flood risk from Milling Brook. It's a complex process as it involves large scale engineering under a main road so it won't happen overnight. We are keen to ensure that it keeps on moving forward and are liaising regularly with the county council.

### Aylburton's wildflower verges

Some of Aylburton's verges have been buzzing with life this last spring and summer, and in places have been very colourful.

A close inspection is usually rewarded with the sight of bees, butterflies and other pollinators, plus a host of grasshoppers, ladybirds and numerous other insects. It is hard to calculate the benefit to wildlife. Each variety of wildflower allowed to grow can support dozens of different invertebrates. (White Clover supports 98 species, Yarrow supports 141 species.) Small mammals such as bank voles, wood mice and shrews will also have benefited by providing food and habitat.

Last year the County Ecologist recorded 46 varieties of grasses and wildflowers on one verge.

Next year, our wildflower verges will get an *extra cut* – and they will be *cut sooner* at the end of the season. The first cut will be in March, to reduce the dominance of grass on the verges, and give wildflowers more of a chance to get established. They will be cut again in



August when most of the flowers will have gone to seed, but before it starts to get too overgrown.

The council is looking to manage some other stretches of verge in a similar way next year, as part of our response to the biodiversity emergency.


We recently welcomed four new members which is very encouraging.

**The** last academic year saw significant changes taking place within our schools; not only have we had to cope with another lockdown and the implications of having to live with the coronavirus, but we have also converted our three schools (Aylburton, Lydney and Bream) to academy status and set up a multi-academy trust to run them — The Severn Federation Academy Trust.

At the end of last term, having managed a nearly full year of covid disruption, we had to close the class 1 'bubble' at Aylburton after five confirmed cases in addition to a number of pupils isolating. Remote learning began on the first day of national lockdown and IT equipment and food parcels were made available to families as required. Thankfully the new term has started on a better footing, but we still have to live with absences due to isolation. Despite this, attendance, either in person or remotely, held up well with a rate of 97%. For the new school year there are 73 pupils on roll and we were, once again, heavily oversubscribed for entry into the reception year.

The pupils continue to achieve good standards of learning. There were no SATs last term, so achievement was assessed by the staff. The results were encouraging and up to at least the expected standard, particularly in Good Level of Development in Early Years, Key Stage 1 Reading, Writing and Maths and similarly for Key Stage 2. As there were no official tests this year there are no comparisons available with national figures.

There have been some staff changes. Mrs Brice moved across to Bream School as the Academy Head and already she has made a significant impact there, with a very positive feedback from our School Improvement

consultant. Mrs Riach decided to retire from teaching at the end of last term and we all thank her for her many years of effort on behalf of our children. Her place in class 2 has been taken by Miss Gaunt, who participated in our School Direct teacher training programme. She will take her place alongside Mrs Isaac in class 1 and Miss Larkham in class 3. Mrs Dare remains as the Executive Head for Aylburton and Lydney. We are also saying goodbye to Mrs Durbin from our 'Listening Post'. We wish her well in a new role within her church.
